Opal Lee came to 4Paws from West Virginia, where she had a litter of kittens while she was in foster. (Rudy and Robin are two, the other three were adopted.) Opal Lee is a short-haired white cat with light green eyes. She is still quite young and playful and will greet humans to solicit pets and interact. Because she was so young when she got pregnant and had her babies, she probably won't get very big. Opal Lee spends a lot of her time looking out the full-length glass door at the back of the foster room. She observes blue-tailed skinks go about their business, watches birds visit

and re-visit the hanging feeders in the mornings and scans the back yard for any activity in the grass or along the tree line. Because of her age her foster thinks she would be playful with teaser toys and chase toys in an adoptive home. But in foster she is abstaining because she is in a room with very active kittens with whom she doesn't want to mingle.

Opal Lee doesn't want to cause conflict with other kitties so she will hunker down and put her ears back if challenged, hoping they will pass her by. She has been observed running and hiding under things to avoid interactions with some cats, even when they are just being playful. She would do well as an only kitty or with a mature, easy-going non-territorial cat. She would do OK with children 14+ and a low- to medium- level activity environment.

Opal Lee has a good appetite and will actively look for flavors she likes when fed communally. She is also a fan of the dry food being served in foster and will sometimes politely wait for the dry food to be served while others are enjoying the canned already. She has been eating Fancy Feast classic pate and Purina One Indoor Advantage kibble. She has been spayed, vaccinated against rabies and distemper, microchipped, and tested for FeLV and FIV with negative results.
