This sweet, playful, and happy kitty was turned over to 4Paws by a rescuer in West Virginia when she was found as a stray. Her left eye appeared injured so her rescuer wanted her to get medical care for it, which he couldn't afford himself. An exam revealed Daisy was born with entropion, which is a deformation of the eyelid causing the lashes to grow inward. Depending on the degree of entropion, it can be a mild nuisance requiring only eye drops, or it can severely affect the eye. In Daisy's case, it was severe and because it was left untreated for so long, she had no vision in the eye. The best option for her was to remove the eye, a surgical procedure called *enucleation*.

Now that her medical troubles are behind her, Daisy romps with the other cats in her foster room and sleeps in the sun. She is very human-oriented and will "plop n' roll" for pets and attention. She is social and will need another pet in her home to keep her company when her humans are absent. Daisy makes cat friends faster with boy cats and accepting girl cats, but some girl cats will start swatting contests with her. So perhaps she would do best with a boy cat friend. She is outgoing and would do well as an only kitty with a cat friendly dog that needs a buddy. She is impervious to a lot of noise and activity so would do well with a family and children of all ages.

Daisy has been spayed, microchipped, vaccinated for rabies and distemper and tested negative for FIV and FeLV. She has been enjoying Fancy Feast classic pate and Purina One indoor kibble.
